



CODE OF CONDUCT AGE MANAGERS

Surf Life Saving Australia Limited (SLSA), including South West Rocks SLSC, is committed to the health, safety, and wellbeing of all its members and is dedicated to providing a safe environment for those participating in surf life saving activities.

The SLSC Member Protection Policy outlines a commitment to a person's right to be treated with respect and dignity and to be safe and protected from abuse. The policy informs everyone involved in Surf Life Saving of his or her legal and ethical rights and responsibilities and the standards of behaviour that are required.

The policy applies to committees; volunteers; support personnel; all members; and any other person including but not limited to participants, guardians, spectators, employees and sponsors to the full extent possible. A full copy of the policy is available at www.swrslsc.com.au

SLSA and SWRSLSC requires every individual to:

- Respect the rights, dignity and worth of others
- Be fair, considerate, and honest in all dealings with others, and be a positive role model
- Make a commitment to providing quality service
- Be aware of, and maintain an uncompromising adherence to SLSA's standard, rules, regulations, and policies
- Demonstrate a high degree of individual responsibility especially when dealing with persons under 18 years of age
- Contribute to the provision of a safe environment to the conduct of all activities within surf life saving
- Abide by the relevant role specific codes of conducts outlines below.

In addition, a SWRSLSC Age Manager will be a positive role model for others by:

- Agree to abide by the code of conduct
- Be responsible for the overall safety and wellbeing of the group
- Be responsible for the group's education
- Take time to plan and prepare the activities delivered to the group
- Foster a collaborative approach to the management of the group
- Instil enjoyment and fun in what they do
- Be a positive role model for surf life savers and SLA.
