

PRESIDENT'S REPORT

The past season has seen great achievement by our Club in all areas and the benefits of previous planning and hard work is fostering a healthy Club culture.

Our patrolling numbers have increased and we managed to negotiate the Life Saving Agreement with SLSNSW to our satisfaction. Whilst this was a tedious process the end result has seen more efficient patrol groups and a small reduction in hours for most.

Patrols were kept busy with large visitation to our beaches and some extreme conditions throughout. The capability of our teams, coordination with UAV pilots and SLSMNC RWC operators and Duty Officers typified our professional approach to beach management. All Patrol Captains and every active member are applicated.

Our patrols go hand in hand with Education and an increase across all categories bolstered our skills base. We gained new IRB drivers which is welcomed and new Bronze members. We have had a small team leading our Education which is a vital component of our ongoing development. Spook, Rebecca, Craig and Brienna have been the inspiration at Club and Branch level. Our role in flood events goes unnoticed but once again response from IRB Crews and on ground support to other agencies should not be discounted.

Whilst there were a number of out of hours call outs, one ended tragically in the loss of a young life. Unfortunately, this was an extraordinary incident that no level of response could have managed. Our members and lifeguards worked alongside other Emergency Services to no avail. I am acutely aware of the effects that this incident had on people involved and we were able to provide support where required.

More positively the banding together at a difficult time strengthened relationships within the Club and Community. The event drew widespread interest and I recognise the sensitive issues that were endured and the way that you all maintained tact.

The Nippers were interrupted by poor weather and unfavourable seas again this season but under the guidance of Ginja Ryan we saw a happy group participate at weekly events and Branch Carnivals. Numbers are gradually improving and the education and surf skills gained by our young charges will prepare them well for next season and indeed for their lifetime.

SWRSLSC conducted the SLS Mid North Coast Branch Championships and we had a good number of both senior and junior competitors taking part, which resulted in us placing third in overall water events. It goes to show we do have some capable

competitors who took home a number of medals. Our Surf Sports has potential for greater participation and success, but a structured approach is required. The male and female boat crews were consistent with the North Coast Boat Series. There are initiatives that we need to advance with activities to encourage more participation in both the Junior and Senior Surf Sports area.

There have been a few new initiatives this season, namely Silver Salties, pool swims Sunday morning swims which all go to the development of our great organisation. The Silver Salties have indeed been a motivation and had a significant contribution to the fabric of our Club.

Another major achievement of significance is the implementation of the Reconciliation Action Plan which is the first in NSW and second in Australia for a surf club. We have always had strong relationship with our Indigenous family, going back to Harry Penrith aka Burnum Burnum completing his Bronze Medallion at SWRSLSC in the 1950s.

Our own Presentation and Awards of Excellence was once again a momentous event with over one hundred guests in attendance – just going to show the strength of the Club within the community.

We have a proud history of conducting many major events on the SLS calendar over many years. Notably this past season we held the Newcastle Permanent SLSMNC Branch Championships and assisted with local Trial Bay Triathlon and a Development Day for the North Coast Boat Series.

Obviously the 2025 Sharkskin SLSA IRB Championships in July were the jewel in the crown. This event was a major success which could not have been achieved without the involvement from our members and community. Whilst a major logistical and work force exercise, the benefits for Club comradery, community spirit, mateship and economic input to the community is immeasurable. One of the stand outs for me was the interaction between nippers, cadets, active members, life members, community people from 8–80 years of age all joining forces. Our expertise is noted amongst SLSA circles and I was immensely proud of the job that we did.

A major component of the Club is our Boulders Bistro, and Bar facilities, over many years we have strived to promote SWRSLSC as a community hub. We provide a venue for members and the community but it is not without much hard work, by both the staff and Board of Directors. This season we acquired a Coffee Van to complement our overall business plan which has been highly successful. I believe we are a major hub

for all in our Community. The efforts of our staff and Alex our Facilities Manager are without peer, and is testament to the strong Club ethos where we are all one Club.

Moving forward we face many lifesaving changes in patrolling, emergency response, education and administration that all places extra load on all members, but we are well prepared and ongoing input from new members is vital. To conclude the season, we proudly hosted the Sharkskin SLSA IRB Championships, a major event that highlighted our club's ability to collaborate effectively with community groups, local council, and Surf Life Saving Australia. DIRECTOR OF FINANCE REPORT

I am pleased to present the financial statements for the year ended 30 April 2025.

The Club had another successful trading year with total revenue of \$1,925,107, up by \$148,466 (8.3%), resulting in a net profit of \$230,726, up by \$9,891 (4.4%).

The relatively modest trading increase of \$127,492 after factoring in price increases demonstrates that we are nearing the maximum trading capacity of facilities. In this regard, it is pleasing to note that other income increased by \$20,974, showing the importance of other sources of income as we go forward.

I would like to thank our managers, Alex Wilcox and Molly McBain, for the excellent work they have done and to all our staff who have been a factor in our excellent result.

A further thank you to Cate Madden of Busy Books Bookkeeping Services for her patience and help she has provided to me.

It would be remiss of me not to mention our mature volunteers (some people refer to them in a derogatory manner) who meet at the club on Tuesdays or whenever required to perform maintenance and repairs around the club. They definitely provide a cost-saving benefit to the club if this work were outsourced. Thank you, John Tyne, Mal, Alan, Wayne and apologies to anyone I missed.

On a personal note, it is with mixed feelings that I advise that I will not be seeking re-election for the position of Director of Finance. After four years in the role and with the ever-increasing need for computer skills, for which I am not up to scratch, I feel it is the right time.

DIRECTOR OF LIFESAVING REPORT

As the Director of Lifesaving for South West Rocks Surf Life Saving Club, it is my privilege to present the annual report for the 2024/2025 season, my fifth season in this role. This year has been defined by the unwavering commitment of our volunteers, whose collective efforts ensured the safety of thousands of beachgoers along our beautiful coastline. Through skilled patrol operations, comprehensive training programs, and proactive community engagement, our club continues to uphold its proud tradition of lifesaving excellence.

Our dedicated patrol teams operated every weekend and public holiday from 28th September through to 27th April. Across the season, seven patrol team members logged a total of 2,171.83 hours, providing a highly visible and effective lifesaving presence on the beach. This season saw 16,999 public attendances, underscoring the vital role our club plays in ensuring safety at South West Rocks.

The number of patrolling members is growing each season, an increase of 56% since the 2020/21 season, to now 86 patrolling members.

Lifesavers conducted 216 preventative actions, 70 first aid treatments, and performed two rescues — each one a testament to their vigilance and training. Additionally, our team managed 25 beach closures due to hazardous surf and responded to a number of serious incident call-outs, one of which sadly resulted in a fatality.

We also had one of our members, Pete Brannelly, deployed as part of the emergency response to assist with the natural disaster that was Tropical Cyclone Alfred.

Our members continue to go above and beyond, and I'd like to acknowledge the top 10 patrolling members by hours contributed this season:

We celebrated our first 'Pink Patrol' on International Women's Day, 8th March, where our patrol was made up of all female members. Even though Tropical Cyclone Alfred was hovering around, and we had to close the beach, it did not dampen the spirit of the day. It was great to promote some of our amazing statistics – female members make up 44% of our patrolling members, our Board of Directors are 63% female, and our General Committee is 47% female — some impressive statistics regarding inclusivity within the club and showcasing the importance of female members in leadership positions.

Lifesaving excellence is built on training, and this season was no exception. We ran multiple courses, which resulted in the following awards - Bronze Medallion x 7 and Surf Rescue Certificate x 2, along with IRB Crew x 4 and Driver x 2 qualifications, First Aid x 9, and Advanced Resuscitation Technique x 9 awards. These programs resulted in the successful up-skilling of members and the recruitment of new patrolling lifesavers.

Special thanks must go to our trainers and assessors, Ian 'Spook' Everingham, Rebecca Mitchell and Craig Schweikert, who volunteer many hours behind the scenes to ensure members are confident and capable. Their dedication directly supports the strength and safety of our patrol teams, their knowledge being second to none. As part of the Education Team, I can vouch for how lucky we are to have these educators in our club and the invaluable part they play. Also, thanks to the other TAFs from the northern clubs – Macksville-Scotts Head, Hat Head and Kempsey-Crescent Head whom we continue to work closely, especially Sue Croad, who facilitates all the First Aid and Advanced Resuscitation for our members.

At the start of the season, we held our second Gotcha4Life 24 Hour Row, in conjunction with Isaac and Amanda Mainey from Ritual Fitness. Due to the ongoing break-ins at the time, we did not feel that it would be safe for our members to be at the club overnight. It was a successful event, and we look forward to an ongoing partnership with Ritual Fitness in the future.

The 2024/25 season was the fourth season that we had offered the early morning pool swims at the South West Rocks pool. Thank you to Debbie Purvis, Mark Notley and Kath Langthorne, who provide their coaching expertise for free to our members. This has been a great initiative, which most clubs would not have available, and we hope that the number of participants increases going into the upcoming season.

On the back of the pool swims a Sunday Morning swim/paddle was introduced for all members of the club, to increase their fitness and skills in the water. Only after a few weeks, this initiative has grown into a partnership with Hat Head Tri Club,

training alongside each other. We hope this fun Sunday get-together continues to build, for those who may wish to engage in additional training for the 2025/26 competition season.

This year saw our members volunteer for events around the South West Rocks community, including water safety for the Trial Bay Triathlon and the South West Rocks NAIDOC Celebrations, as well as marshalls for the South West Rocks Runfest. Our community engagement and relationships throughout not just South West Rocks but the wider Macleay Valley continue to grow and prosper. These initiatives included:

- In September, we held an information session for Clontarf Students from Kempsey High and Melville High on pathways through Surf Life Saving. This included some water activities, touch footy on the beach and presentations surrounding all things red and yellow and paid opportunities as lifeguards or drone operators.
- October saw parishioners from the South West Rocks Catholic Church Our Lady Star of the Sea, attend a CPR and defib awareness session to provide education on how to use their new defib.
- Our Term 4 annual school water safety talks continued to grow, and we visited South West Rocks Public School, Smithtown Public School, Gladstone Public School and Kempsey South Public School. Thank you to Renee, Ginja and Sophie, who gave up their time to visit the schools and spread the importance of water safety.
- In January, we held the first Badaar Nippers holiday program for children from Kempsey South Public School. This has been a wonderful initiative, and we are looking at expanding this program in the upcoming season.
- After the flooding event in May, we reached out to our local community to donate non-perishable items for our local flood victims. The response was overwhelming and very generous. When the items were delivered to families, there needed to be two trips to be able to fit all the hampers into the ute. A testament to the South West Rocks community.

It would be remiss not to mention the newest movement of members at the SWRSLSC – our Silver Salties. On the 30thSeptember, the first program of activities started, facilitated by Anne Pearce, Debbie Purvis and Jennie Grahame, with Chair Yoga and Walk/Swim Sessions. This then grew to include a third option of a Gentle Exercise Class. We are now onto our third round of programs, with no chance of slowing down. The Silver Salties membership is now over 60 members and continuing to grow – they have their own t-shirts and have become important

members of the club, assisting with various roles to support the committee. This initiative has no doubt been a major success for the 65+ years demographic – promoting inclusion, social connection, fitness and water safety. Congratulations to Greg Lawton, our first Silver Salties member, who gained his Bronze Medallion and to the members who have overcome their fears of the surf and are loving being in the water on a weekly basis.

SWRSLSC hosted an ALBERT Course in March. This course is for current IRB Crew and Drivers who are looking to upskill to more advanced training. Facilitated by SLSNSW coaches, close to 50 participants from North Coast and Lower North Coast joined our Mid North Coast Members in what was a great weekend of powercraft upskilling.

As we prepare for the 2025/2026 season, our focus will be on strengthening our patrol teams, expanding community education, and securing funding for equipment and member development. We are also prioritising mental health support and recognition for our volunteers — ensuring they feel valued and empowered to continue serving.

My sincere thanks go to every volunteer, TAF, committee member, and supporter. The collective dedication of our club family is the foundation of everything we achieve. Special thanks to the families of our patrolling members, whose support behind the scenes makes such a difference.

Together, we are not only saving lives—we are building a stronger, safer, more connected community.
